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	Rat infestation
	1. The pest control company did a treatment in the play area on Sept. 20,
	2017. The play structure remains out of bounds until we receive the all-clear
	from the pest control company.
	2. Facilities staff also reviewed the area around the school, to see if there has
	been any new construction/earth works that may have caused a disturbance,
	causing the rats to seek another place to nest. Nothing close by was found.
	Facilities staff also reviewed the green bins/garbage bins of the school –and
	these are well secured and there have been no issues with rats getting food from
	the school's green bins. Facilities staff have contacted the City to see if there are
	any infestation issues reported elsewhere in this neighbourhood – waiting for a
	reply from City.
	3. The engineered hardwood mulch in both play structure areas was
	replenished at the end of July 2017. The existing mulch would have been raked
	and then new mulch added to this.
	4. On Aug 7, 2017 - the play structures were inspected as part of the Board's
	annual inspection of all play structures. Minor repairs were recommended. This
	was undertaken by Maintenance staff during the summer.

Fans (commercial + mounted) are acceptable but we have a lack of outlets in the rooms. *need to find out expected wait time for maintenance to be approved for fan installation (mounted) if CSPC provides fans.
